




Referrals must be through GPs and/or RACF staff through the Amity Health referral form.

Who are Amity Health?

Amity Health is a not-for-profit organisation providing health and community programs and services to people living in regional areas across the Great Southern, Wheatbelt, South-Coastal Goldfields and Mid-west regions of WA.

Connections Count

Amity Health provides a funded counselling program called **CONNECTIONS COUNT** to residents of RACF's in the Mid-West region of WA. Our team of Counsellors are formally qualified and experienced.

The program is for residents of RACF's who are experiencing low to moderate mental health and/or psychological distress including:

- depression
- anxiety
- past trauma
- grief
- life transitions

Appointment options

Assessments and appointments are offered in-person at the residential aged care facility. Appointments will be:

- low intensity and the least intrusive
- provided by qualified Amity Health mental health clinicians
- free of charge

Available to mid-west RACF residents in:

- Nazareth House
- Juniper Hillcrest
- Opal Geraldton

Referral Pathways

If you are a GP or a RACF health practitioner, you can make a referral on behalf of the resident.

Eligibility Criteria

- must be a resident of one of the RACF's mentioned in flyer
- must be at a risk of developing a mild to moderate mental health illness, or have a diagnosed mental health illness, with mild to moderate symptoms
- not be eligible for, or are more appropriate for, Government Older Persons Mental Health Service
- · would benefit from counselling.

Exclusions

The Connections Count program is not for residents with:

- long term psychological interventions or high intensity/specialist services
- high risk needing urgent care (within seven days)
- complex post-traumatic stress disorder
- personality disorders
- dementia
- delirium
- intellectual disability.
