Amity Health Integrated Team Care

Are you an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander? Are you living with or at risk of developing any of the following chronic conditions?

- cancer
- cardiovascular disease
- chronic kidney disease
- chronic respiratory disease
- diabetes

Our Integrated Team Care program is available to you if you live in the Great Southern, Coastal Wheatbelt or Southern Wheatbelt regions.

Our Care Coordinators can help you to access a range of health services and specialist care, including a variety of aides and equipment to better manage your health such as:

- dose administration aids
- assistive breathing equipment
- blood sugar/glucose monitoring equipment
- medical footwear prescribed & fitted by a podiatrist
- mobility aids such as crutches, walking frames & shower chairs
- spectacles (exclusions apply)

(Please note that dental care is not funded within this program.)

Are you Eligible?

To be eligible for the Integrated Team Care program, you must identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander and:

- Be enrolled for chronic disease management in a general practice
- Have a management plan from your Doctor or Health Practitioner
- Be referred by your Doctor or Health Practitioner
- Have an Amity Health consent form




Amity Health is a registered NDIS provider.
